ing in Lincoln, N.H., the lobby at RiverWalk Resort looks less like a gathering of hotel guests and more like a family reunion. New owners swap ski tips with families returning for school break; a toddler in a puffy snowsuit presses a nose to the window, eager to play in last night's fresh snowfall. This is the quiet magic of Phase II at River-Walk: not simply more rooms or new amenities, but a larger circle of people who call this place home, even if it is just for a week at a time.

The resort's expansion has landed with unmistakable warmth. The West Wing opened last year to a chorus of owners describing that cherished 'home away from home" feeling: spacious suites that feel like a modern home, public areas that hum without shouting, and a roster of comforts that read like a wish list written by multigenerational travelers. There are the on-site winery and tasting room, a destination spa, and one of New England's largest lagoon pools, plus fitness studios, restaurants, and a Grand Ballroom that is becoming the premier wedding and event destination in the area. These features are not novelties anymore; they are simply how life unfolds there, the everyday luxuries that make vacationing with grandparents, toddlers, and teenagers so convenient, and some of the many reasons

people choose to purchase there as well.

However, the RiverWalk story is as much about place as it is about property. The resort sits at the heart of two vibrant towns, Lincoln and Woodstock, where cafés, breweries and trailheads are stitched together by the shared culture of the Western White Mountains. The sense of community is tangible: kids trading trail maps at breakfast, locals pointing visitors to a favorite pizza spot, and owners who return often enough to be greeted by name. It is a village energy with mountain ambition.

That mountain ambition has been defined by one of the largest and most popular ski resorts in the East for nearly 60 years. T the next chapter of this groundbreaking resort is crystallizing just across the river. Loon Mountain's Flight Path: 2030, a decade-long plan to "Pioneer the NEW New England", has already reshaped the South Peak side

of the mountain with new trails, lifts, and a broadened footprint that pushes skiable terrain past 400 acres. The expansion adds breadth for families learning together and depth for skiers seeking quiet, gladed mornings, an evolution that strengthens Loon as a true four-season hub, and when completed will be nearly 1,000 skiable acres, making it one of the largest ski resorts in the East.

While Loon Mountain continues its march toward elite ski destination status, the connection and accessibility to the surrounding community is what truly makes the overall destination special. Connection is both the theme and the headline for RiverWalk, who, in partnership with Loon and South Peak Resort, will soon be directly linked to the mountain by New England's first Pulse-Gondola: a 1,300foot river-spanning lift with twelve enclosed cabins, slated to begin operation for the 2026-27 winter season. For owners and guests, it promises something rare in the East, carfree access from Main Street to first chair, from après back to the fireside, and an effortless hand-off between the rhythms of town and the pull of the peak.

That same gondola will be a cornerstone of South Peak's emerging village plan, a walkable base area envisioned with dining, retail, nightlife, and family-friendly winter and summer activities. Imagine mornings that begin with groomer laps, drift into a long lunch in the village, and end with a wine tasting and dinner looking up at the headlights of the groomers, prepping tomorrow's perfect corduroy, an arc of the day that transforms convenience into core memories.

What sets RiverWalk apart in this coveted mountain destination is not just its address, two hours from Boston, steps from Lincoln's Main Street, but its identity. Owners describe joining a 'family," and the resort seems built for that word: kitchens that invite big, messy breakfasts; balconies angled to mountains that spark dinnertable plans; and staff who remember which kid prefers hot chocolate to cider. In a marketplace where second homes can drift toward the transactional, RiverWalk leans into belonging.

Moreover, that is the promise: a premier ownership experience that reads less like a real-estate pitch and more like an invitation to return to the

same view, the same trails, the same neighbors, season after season. With Phase II fully alive and Loon's next decade accelerating, RiverWalk stands at a rare confluence of family, community and connection. The mountain is getting closer. The circle is getting wider. And the best days, powder or pool, feel designed to be shared.



The rental shop also welcomed new skis, snowboards, and boots, giving guests access to high-quality gear.



ELK IS CLOSE to HOME with GREAT GROOMING and SNOWMAKING

UNION DALE, PA — It all started in 1959, when a mountain became a new recreation complex for skiing. Elk Mountain, as it was named, started out with only a handful of trails. Today Elk Mountain Ski Resort has evolved into a sprawling 27 trails and some of the most challenging terrain in Pennsylvania. During its opening year, Elk featured a small base lodge (now the picnic lodge), a 2,200-foot T-bar and several slopes. There were also some rope tows and a small warming hut built a few years earlier by the Scranton Ski Club.

The first Hall double chair was installed in 1961, heralding the development of five expert trails and various intermediate trails from the top. Elk's first expert trail, completed before the chairlift itself, was host to the 1960 Pennsylvania State Championships. Enthusiastic competitors and gatekeepers actually walked to the summit from the top of the T-bar to run the race.

A year later in 1962, snowmaking was installed and a new A-frame base lodge was built. Skiing at Elk got a lift - quite literally with the installation of a beginners J-bar in 1964 and a double chair-lift from the lower parking lot to the top of the mountain in 1965.

The original T-bar was replaced with a chairlift in 1969, and the J-bar was retired for a double chairlift in 1973. Skiers saw Elk in a whole new light when, in 1966, lighting was installed on the East and West slopes for night skiing. Lighting was installed along three summit trails in 1972. Now a large number of trails are lit for night skiing, including the entire beginner area.

UNIONDALE, PA - Elk Mountain is an independent mountain dedicated to great grooming and snowmaking. It is a big mountain experience without the drive. Scan the QR in the ad to buy lift tickets online.

Elk Mountain continued to build on that legacy of great skiing when it upgraded its snowmaking ability by adding tower mount snow guns on the Tecumseh trail. Additional guns were also placed on Stomping Grounds Terrain Park. These guns helped to ensure better coverage in the most challenging ski seasons.

From the recently upgraded and resurfaced parking lots to the more than 1,000 Norway and White Spruce trees that were planted slopeside, your Elk experience is always a pleasant and environmentally friendly one from arrival to departure.

First-time skiers, established skiers, or snowboarders looking to learn or fine-tune their skills can do so with a lesson from a member of the Elk Mountain Ski School.

The school is a member of the Professional Ski Instructors of America (PSIA) and utilizes the American Teaching System. With a Affected (PSIA) and utilizes the Affected Feaching System. With a staff of approximately 75 trained instructors, Elk has a program and the staff to meet your individual needs. Class sizes are limited to provide a quality experience.
