Unseen since 2019, the new expo will take place at the Boston Hynes Convention Center

BOSTON, MA – Snowbound Expo will bring together thousands of skiers, snowboarders and families to Boston, Mass., to see over 120 brands and an incredible line up of inspirational speakers. Previously known as the Boston Ski & Snowboard Expo and rebranded under new event organizer Raccoon Media Group in partnership with the Snow-sports Industries America (SIA), Snowbound Expo will take place, Nov. 18 to 20, 2022, at the Boston Hynes Convention Center.

Ski resorts can be enjoyed in many ways. At the areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers.

Observe the code listed below and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.

1. Always stay in control.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way.
3. Stop in a safe place for you and others.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging, look uphill and yield.
5. Use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe signs and warnings, and keep off closed trails.
7. Know how to use the lifts safely.
