If you want a wildlife experience, look no further than the north edge of Jackson at the National Elk Refuge where thousands of elk winter in the refuge. The elk begin their migration out of the high meadows in the fall, usually after the first snowstorm. They stay in the refuge through the spring when food in their higher habitat becomes more abundant.

The sleigh rides into the elk herd are available via a private contractor, Double H Bar, Inc. The National Elk Refuge also offers educational and daily programs at the Jackson Hole and Greater Yellowstone Visitor Center. Please call (307) 733-0277 to book your ride.

Mask Up for Safety

At JHMR, all guests will be required to wear face coverings over both nose and mouth at all times while riding all lifts, when loading, and when standing in lift lines as well as inside facilities. Guests are recommended to wear a dry face covering when possible for

Guests also are required to wear face coverings in all other indoor and outdoor public areas, including village common areas, upper mountain common areas, inside all buildings and facilities, in line mazes and, as mentioned above, when loading, riding, and unloading lifts, gondolas, and the aerial tram. The only exceptions are when skiing and riding and when seated for dining. JHMR recommends face coverings be constructed with multi-layer fabric materials. Single layer Buffs, bandanas,
